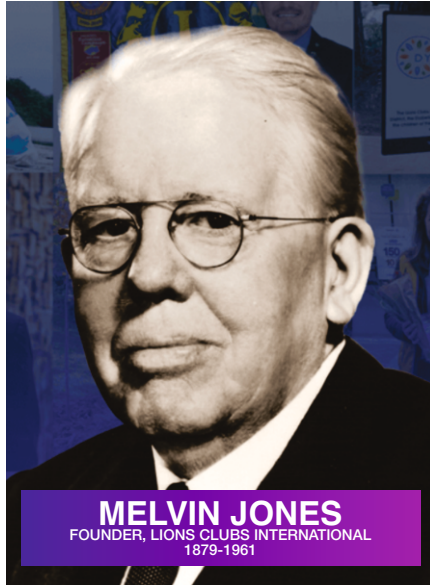

It is with gratitude to God and readiness to serve that I, Lion Phina Origho PMJF, NLCF, accept your election as the Pioneer District Governor of 404B5 for the 2026/2027 Lions service year. I accept this mantle of service that has been bestowed upon me to serve our community at large with honour.

I acknowledge the work of our past and present leaders, club presidents, and members across the district. The progress we see today is the result of consistent effort over time, often under challenging conditions. Your commitment to service has sustained this district and created the foundation we now build on.

I also recognize the contributions of our Leos and younger members, whose energy and participation continue to strengthen the future of our work.

As I assume this role, I do so with a clear understanding of the responsibility it carries. I commit to serving with accountability, transparency, and focus. Decisions will be guided by what strengthens the district, supports our members, and improves the outcomes of our service.

Our reflection for the 2026 2027 Service Year Lions District 404B5, Nigeria:

Over the past few years, our work across multiple areas, including vision care, diabetes prevention and treatment, and community health improvement, has been significant in assisting underserved areas in the district. These interventions reflect our club's commitment to improving health and well-being, strengthening communities, and supporting those in need through humanitarian services. For many of us, we have seen firsthand the impact of this in communities where many have been forgotten, but whose dignity is restored by the work we do, serving as a beacon of hope.

The district we serve is peculiar in the scope of its needs and the vast humanitarian gaps created by current socioeconomic conditions. In recent times, these conditions have been worsened by food insecurity and rising inflation, resulting in a cost-of-living crisis that is forcing families to reduce food quality, skip meals, and face rising malnutrition. According to UNICEF, 25 - 27 million Nigerians are estimated to be at high risk of food insecurity, and malnutrition as a direct or underlying cause of 45% of all deaths of children under five in Nigeria. This issue is increasingly difficult to ignore across our communities in Lagos, Ekiti, Oyo, and Kwara States. Food insecurity is a social determinant of health (SDOH) that influences physical and mental health outcomes, such as chronic disease and results in higher healthcare expenditures, especially in children.

In a call to action, we began our ongoing Food Bank Initiative, an idea that couldn't be more urgent.

District 404B5 Food Bank Initiative:

The goal of establishing a food bank is to build a central facility that can store, manage, and distribute food efficiently, ensuring consistent access to food, especially during our current economic downturn. A system that is organized, reliable, and sustainable. If executed, our fully established food bank would serve at least 3,000–5,000 households monthly, reaching an estimated 15,000 - 25,000 individuals across Lagos and more within the first year of operation. The facility will aim to store and distribute a minimum of 50–75 metric tons of food monthly, supported by a structured distribution network and community partnerships.

The scale of what is required is significant. Establishing this will require coordinated effort, strong stakeholder partnerships, and disciplined team execution. This service year presents an opportunity to move from our planned intent to a structured approach. To build something that can outlast individual tenures and continue to serve our communities over time.

As your leader, I intend to take responsibility for seeing the project through fruition, empowering the community we serve. I commit to making decisions that strengthen our club's systems, support members, and ensure that service efforts translate into measurable outcomes.

The strength of District 404B5 will depend on its ability to work collectively. Growth in membership, stronger partnerships, and active engagement will all play a role, but they must be tied to clear objectives and sustained action, which our club's attributes already foster. The theme for the year, "Behold; Power of Service", reflects this perspective. It marks the beginning of a new service year and an important phase in the district's development. With focus, collaboration, and accountability, District 404B5 is positioned to build a foundation that will support both current and future service efforts.

Core Project: District 404B5 Food Bank Initiative

The Lions District 404B5 Food Bank Initiative is a strategic response to one of the most pressing humanitarian challenges of our time, hunger and food insecurity. As Lions committed to the global cause of Service Above Self, this initiative seeks to provide immediate relief to food insecurity, a critical social determinant of health (SDOH) and build a sustainable system that ensures consistent access to food for vulnerable populations across Lagos State and beyond.

The Growing Hunger Crisis in Nigeria – Evidence-Based Needs Assessment:

Hunger in Nigeria has reached alarming levels, cutting across both rural and urban communities. Recent data paints a sobering picture:

- Approximately 25–27 million Nigerians are currently facing acute food insecurity. Projections indicate that this number could rise to 34.7 million in the coming years.
- According to the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO), an estimated 172 million Nigerians cannot afford a balanced diet, resulting to widespread nutritional deficiency.
- Even in urban centers like Lagos, often perceived as economically vibrant, the reality is stark. A recent study by the Lagos Food Bank, conducted across selected low-income communities in Lagos State revealed approximately 72% of these households are moderately to severely food insecure.

This crisis is driven by multiple factors including inflation, unemployment, insecurity affecting farming, climate change, and rising food prices. Against this backdrop, the proposed Lions District 404B5 Food Bank Initiative is timely and transformative. Its importance can be viewed through several critical lenses:

1. Humanitarian Intervention

The project will serve as a lifeline for vulnerable groups - children, the elderly, low-income families, and displaced persons providing them with access to essential food supplies.

2. Reduction of Malnutrition

By ensuring availability of nutritious food items, the project will help combat malnutrition, particularly among children and pregnant women, thereby improving health outcomes and reducing mortality rates.

3. Poverty Alleviation

Food insecurity is deeply intertwined with poverty. By reducing the burden of feeding, families can redirect limited resources to other essential needs such as education and healthcare.

4. Strengthening Community Resilience

A structured food bank system enhances the capacity of communities to withstand economic shocks, emergencies, and unforeseen crises.

5. Alignment with Global Goals

The initiative aligns with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goal 2 – Zero Hunger, reinforcing the Lions' commitment to global service impact.

District 404B5 Food Bank Initiative Program Plan Summary Program Goal

To establish and operationalise a centralised food bank facility in Lagos that provides consistent, safe, and equitable access to food for vulnerable populations across Lagos, Ekiti, Oyo, and Kwara States, while building a sustainable system for long-term food distribution.

SMART Objectives

Fundraising

By the end of the 2026–2027 service year, raise at least 750 million naira toward the establishment of the District Food Bank, while securing multi-year funding commitments or partnerships covering at least 30 – 40% of projected operational costs for the subsequent 2 - 5 years.

Infrastructure Development

By 2026 – 2027 service year, secure and develop a functional food bank facility in Lagos, including storage, handling, and basic distribution infrastructure.

Operational Capacity

By 2026 – 2027 service year, establish a plan for a working distribution system capable of handling 50 – 75 metric tons of food monthly, including storage, inventory management, and logistics coordination.

Beneficiary Reach

Within the first 12 months of operation, provide consistent food support to 3,000 – 5,000 households per month, reaching approximately 15,000 – 25,000 individuals across the target areas.

Partnership Development

Within the first 9 months, formalise partnerships with at least 10 key stakeholders, including corporate donors, food suppliers, NGOs, and community-based organizations to support food sourcing and distribution.

Volunteer/Member and Staffing Structure

By 2026 – 2027 service year, recruit and train a core operational team (member, staff, and volunteers) to manage warehouse startup operations, logistics, and plan for community distribution.

Monitoring and Reporting

By 2026 – 2027 service year, implement a standardised tracking and reporting system to monitor food volume, distribution frequency, beneficiary reach, and operational efficiency monthly.

EXPECTED OUTCOMES

Short-Term Outcomes (0 – 12 months)

- Establishment of a functional food bank facility.
- Regular monthly food distribution to identified communities.
- Improved access to food for targeted households.
- Increased coordination between Lions clubs and local partners.
- Improved tracking and visibility of service impact.

Long-Term Outcomes (1 – 5 years)

- Reduction in acute food shortages among beneficiary communities.
- Improved nutritional stability, particularly among children and vulnerable groups.
- Strengthened community resilience to economic and food supply shocks.
- A sustainable, scalable food distribution model that can expand beyond initial locations to Ekiti, Oyo, and Kwara

States.

- Stronger partnerships between Lions, private sector actors, and community organisations.

KEY ACTIVITIES AND TACTICS

Facility Development

- Pursue fundraising/grant sponsorships for initiative.
- Identify and secure location for the food bank.
- Procure and install storage systems (shelving, cold storage).
- Set up basic operational infrastructure (administrative and inventory systems, food handling processes).

Food Sourcing and Supply Chain

- Engage corporate partners, farms, wholesalers, and markets for food donations or subsidised supply.
- Establish scheduled collection and delivery systems.
- Implement basic quality control and food safety processes.

Distribution System

- Identify target communities and beneficiary groups using local data and club networks.
- Partner with community-based organisations for last-mile distribution.
- Develop a consistent distribution schedule (e.g., monthly cycles).

Staffing and Member/Volunteer Engagement

- Recruit operational staff, members, and volunteers.
- Provide basic training in logistics, food handling, and reporting.
- Assign roles across warehouse management, coordination, and distribution.

Partnerships and Engagement

- Formalise agreements with corporate sponsors and logistics partners.
- Engage local NGOs and community leaders for outreach and beneficiary identification.
- Maintain regular communication with partners to ensure continuity.

Communication and Reporting

- Track distribution metrics monthly.
- Share periodic updates with stakeholders and donors.
- Document activities to support transparency and future funding.

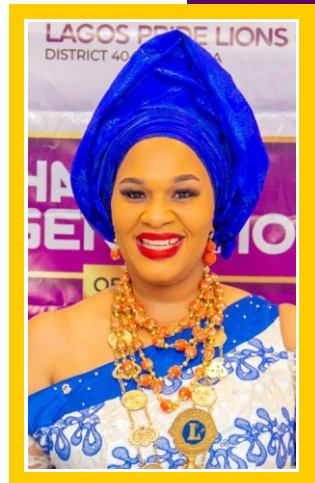

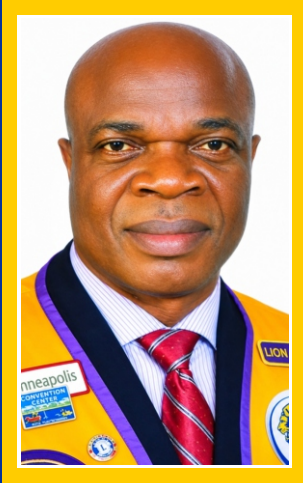

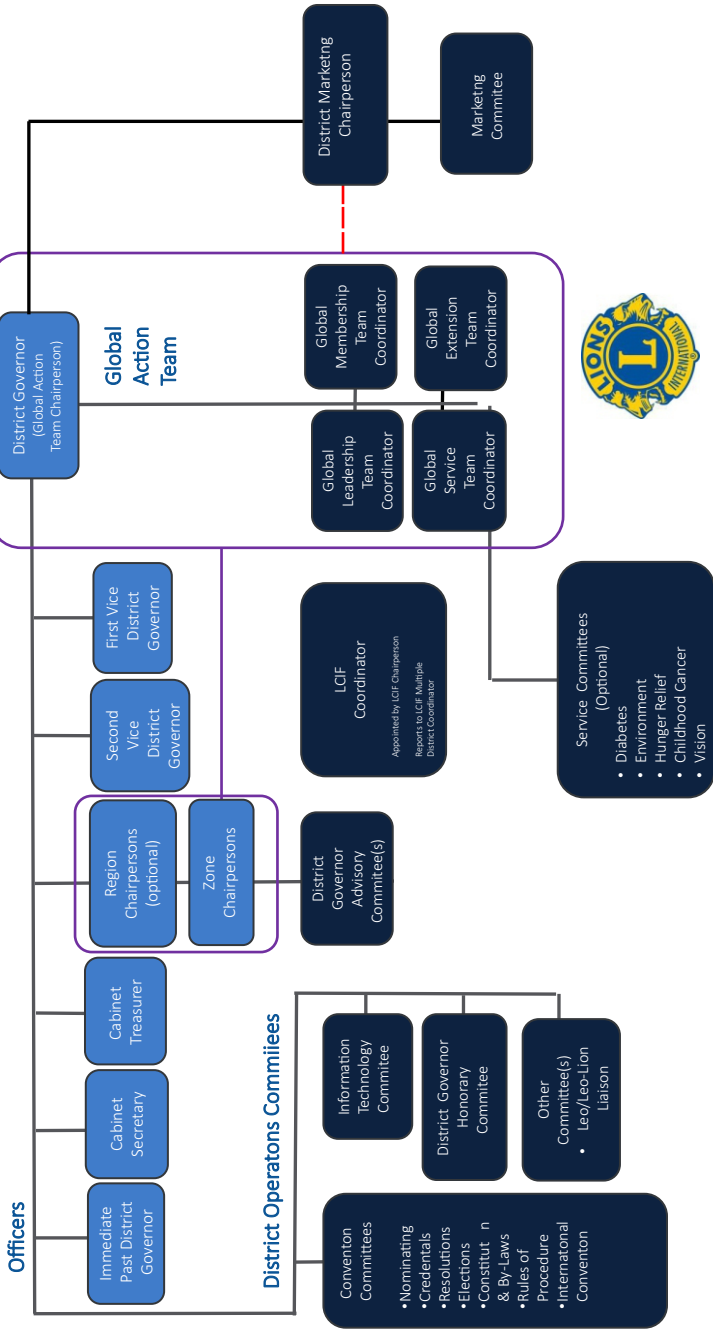
